



On 22 August 2012, a group of officers from the 411th Armoured Infantry Battalion paid a visit to Headquarters Multinational Corps Northeast (HQ MNC NE) to get acquainted with the Corps' tasks, missions and organisation.

Another thing was to present them the peacetime establishment of the Headquarters and the actual number of German staff serving at Baltic Barracks in Szczecin. *“Also what Chief Visitors and Observers Bureau Lieutenant Colonel Boris Schnelle said about life in Szczecin, in Poland, which is just across the border was very interesting,”* he added.
