### **Three days in Wrocław**

As soon as the ladies arrived in Wrocław, they went for a common dinner, after which the participants went either to a music bar or had a stroll in the city centre. A professional tourist guide was very helpful in presenting the most remarkable and interesting places in the city. "Everybody enjoyed that even though it was rather tiring", Mrs Stolp said.
