



On the occasion of the Remembrance Day, the Commander of the Multinational Corps Northeast Lieutenant General Rainer Korff participated in the wreath laying ceremony at the German war cemetery in the Polish village Glinna, next to Stare Czarnowo, on 12 November 2011.

“Only those who are forgotten are dead,” said Mrs Beate Schlupp, the Vice President of Mecklenburg-Vorpommern Parliament, who also noticed that the ceremony is a proof of good German-Polish cooperation and friendship. *“It is important to remember the past but it is more important to look forward,”* added the reverent Bernhard Riedel who said the prayer during the ceremony.

The delegation of the Multinational Corps Northeast as well as the Vice President of Szczecin Mr Mariusz Kądziołka, Honorary Consul of the Federal Republic of Germany Mr Bartłomiej Sochański, the Chief of the Mecklenburg-Vorpommern Police Knut Abramowski, soldiers of the 41st Armoured Brigade and many others – about 50 people altogether – gathered at the cemetery to commemorate German soldiers who died during World War II.
