**On 17 September 2012, representatives of Multinational Corps Northeast (MNC NE) and Command Support Brigade (CSB) participated in two out of many other held countrywide ceremonies paying homage to the dead and deported Poles during the Soviet aggression on Poland in 1939 and the following years.**

In spite of the fact that MNC NE is currently involved in Anakonda 12 exercise and most of staff are taking part in so-called mini exercise conducted in Wałcz, the MNC NE Command Group joined in the ceremony of 17 September held in Wałcz, whereas Senior National Representatives of the Corps' Framework Nations, i.e. Denmark, Germany and Poland, took part in the remembrance event held in Szczecin.
