NATO Biannual G7 Workshop was chaired by Assisting Chief of Staff G7 Division of Multinational Corps Northeast Lieutenant Colonel Olaf Werner, German Army, and co-chaired by Force Command Heidelberg along with representatives from NATO headquarters, commands, agencies and other institutions as well as from Headquarters United States Army Europe, Baltic Defence College and the Pearson Centre.

The workshop is traditionally conducted twice a year and provides an excellent opportunity to discuss, coordinate and synchronize training & exercise programs and activities, especially mutual training support to exercises, including vital ISAF mission Subject Matter Expert support to respective headquarters' ISAF pre-deployment training. Other subjects, such as NATO Forces Standards, Land Advocacy, long term rotation plans, Combat Readiness Evaluation issues, ISAF and NRF preparations and training & exercise related areas in support of a 'Smart Defence' concept, were also discussed.
