

Making an autumn day green

Monday, 26 November 2012, was a typical “green day” for the military personnel of the Multinational Corps Northeast (MNC NE). It is the day when the main focus is placed on improvement of traditional military skills.

All nations follow their own regulations and concepts on how to spend a green day. Sometimes the opportunity is taken to examine soldiers in physical fitness; in other cases, it is used as an excellent occasion to develop, for example, shooting skills, and ensure various “refresher courses”.

The German personnel of the Multinational Corps Northeast spent their green day at a shooting range near Jägerbrück where they trained marksmanship. Also Poles chose shooting as the main topic for their green day. Moreover, the Polish staff members were provided with the first aid training, nuclear biological and chemical (NBC) training, and additional theory of using a weapon.

The Danish personnel gathered in the vicinity of the Głębokie Lake. Over there, with full equipment, they did several physical exercises. Afterwards, they set off for a march. Having been provided with maps and coordinates, they were supposed to reach to five places in the forest where different tasks were prepared related to e.g. knowledge about weapons, reporting
