



Family Care Centre is an organisation created to provide care for families of servicemen of the Multinational Corps Northeast deployed to a mission area. The offered support varies substantially ranging from technical help in domestic matters, through nanny service to organising social events.

For the first time, the Centre was activated during the Corps' first deployment to Afghanistan in 2007. During six months of its functioning, the Centre became an integral part of the Corps' structure and a kind of a cultural centre. The Family Care Centre was suspended the moment the mission in Afghanistan was completed in August 2007.

The Centre was reactivated again on 19 November 2009 to assist the families of the servicemen participating in the Corps' second mission in Afghanistan (from February to August 2010). After the mission was accomplished, the organisation has been put into a sleeping mode and will be reactivated in the future, if necessary.
